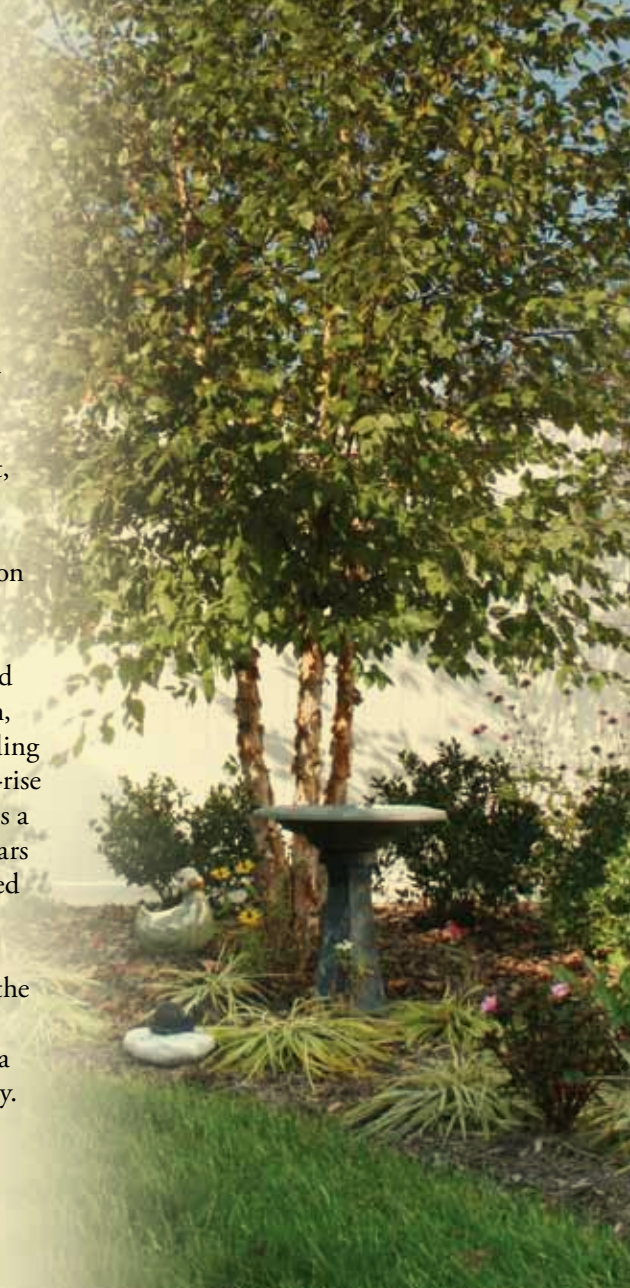
Ruth continues her hobbies of quilting and sewing and also enjoys reading.

## Meet our new Marketing Staff: Melissa Carpenter



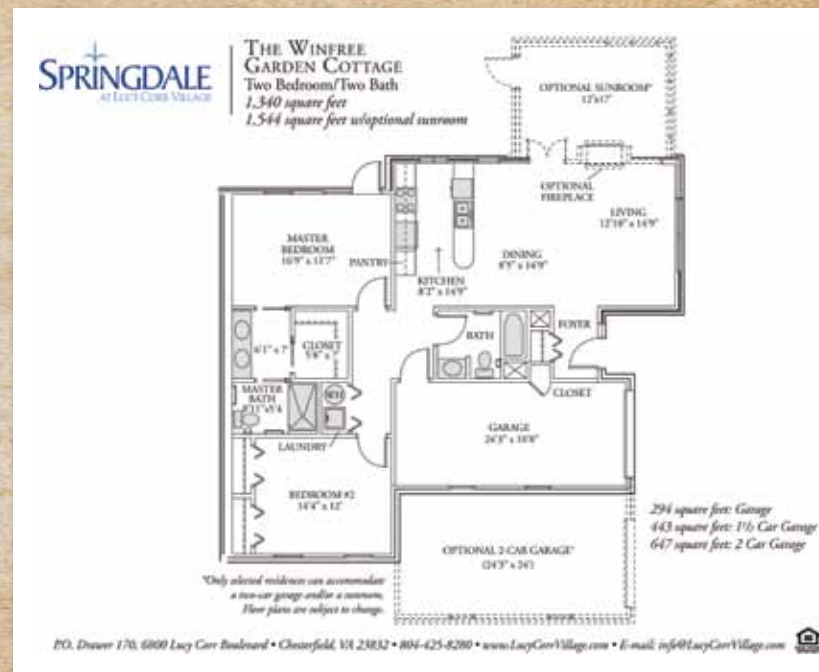
